#### **Program Mission**

**Program Description:** The mission of the Southern Regional Technical College Radiology Program Moultrie is to provide a comprehensive education, which will prepare graduates with the entry-level skills necessary to seek employment as a radiographer and receive an Associate's Degree at the end of the program.

Successful completion of the program will enable students to sit for the Radiography examination administered by the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists.
