**Associate of Science in Nursing (ASN) Generic Program**  
**Spring Semester 2025 (January 2025)**  
**Competitive Admission Procedures**

For admission into the occupational courses of the SRTC Associate of Science ASN Generic Program, requirements as outlined by the College must be met. Admission to the program is academically competitive.

If needed, prospective students will be ranked by several factors and the top candidates will be admitted to the Spring Semester 2025 (January 2025) class. Applications and admission requirements submitted after the posted deadlines will be held and reviewed for the next available class. Deadline for the January 2025 class is **Thursday, September 26, 2024**. Students will be notified by mail regarding their acceptance status once all file evaluations are complete.

**Acceptance/Denial letters will be mailed out Monday, October 21, 2024.**

**Admissions Requirements:**

1. Submit SRTC Admission Application and pay the one-time \$25 application fee. Applications are available online through the college website by clicking the blue box marked “APPLY NOW” or using the following: <https://mysouthernregional.force.com/apply>
2. Submit proof of age. (*Must be 18 years or older at the time of program entry*). Either a valid state driver’s license or birth certificate is acceptable.
3. Submit **official** transcripts for high school diploma/GED **AND all** colleges and/or technical colleges (transferrable credit or not) mailed to the SRTC Registrar’s Office; Southern Regional Technical College, 800 Veteran’s Parkway North, Moultrie, GA 31788.
4. Submit acceptable Admission Placement Exam scores OR have successfully completed with a “C” or better transferable degree-level English and Math from a regional or national accredited college, university, or other postsecondary institution recognized by the US Department of Education at the time the coursework was completed. These courses must be equivalent to the entry-level English and math required for our Associate of Science in Nursing Program. Acceptable Admissions Placement Exams include: ACT, SAT, PSAT, ACCUPLACER (Classic and Next Generation), GED, Georgia Milestones, HiSET, High School GPA, COMPASS and ASSET. A student possessing an associate’s degree or higher from a regionally accredited institution will be exempt from the placement requirements.
5. ASN applicants are required to complete all **highlighted pre-requisite courses** listed below by the September 26, 2024 deadline. **Highlighted prerequisite courses** must meet the **3.0 GPA** requirement. If a prerequisite course has been taken more than once, only the last attempt is counted for prerequisite GPA purposes. Grades of “D, F, and W” are considered unsuccessful attempts. Courses exempted or articulated do not carry GPA points.

Pre-requisite GPA courses are as follows:

ENGL 1101 Composition and Rhetoric (3 Hours)

Any Degree-Level Math (3 Hours)

BIOL 2113 Anatomy & Physiology I (3 Hours)

BIOL 2113L Anatomy & Physiology I Lab (1 Hour)

BIOL 2114 Anatomy & Physiology II (3 Hours)

BIOL 2114L Anatomy & Physiology II Lab (1 Hour)

The following pre-requisite courses must be completed with a “C” or better by the END of fall semester 2024:

PSYC 1101 Introductory Psychology (3 Hours)

General Education Elective (3 Hours)

Humanities/Fine Arts (3 Hours)

COLL 1500 Student Success (3 Hours)

BIOL 2117 Intro Microbiology (3 Hours)

BIOL 2117L Intro Microbiology Lab (1 Hour)

**NOTE:** BIOL 2113, BIOL 2113L, BIOL 2114, BIOL 2114L, BIOL 2117, BIOL 2117L, and any degree-level math will not be considered if completed more than 5 years before admission to the ASN Program.

Failure to have completed ALL nursing pre-requisites will result in a delay in your acceptance date to the program.

6. All ASN applicants are required to take and attain the required score on a Pre-Admission Assessment (TEAS) exam, prior to being accepted into the ASN Program. The ATI TEAS (Test of Essential Academic Skills) is a timed exam that includes questions in the following areas: English, Math, Reading and Science. Applicants are strongly encouraged not to take the TEAS exam until completing A&P I and II OR at least completing A&P I and some of A&P II. Applicants must also have a completed file prior to taking the TEAS exam (excluding current college coursework).

The total adjusted individual TEAS score requirement for the ASN Generic program is **60%**. Applicants will be allowed **two** attempts to meet the 60% required score. Any applicant that is unsuccessful on the first TEAS exam is strongly encouraged to remediate prior to retaking the TEAS exam. Several copies of the 2022-2023 ATI TEAS Study Manual (v. 7) are in our SRTC Libraries. The TEAS study book can also be purchased online at <https://atitesting.com/teas/study-manual>.

Any applicant that does not attain the required TEAS score of 60% after two attempts will not be considered for admission into the ASN Program. However, applicants can reapply to the ASN Program and take the ASN Pre-Admission exam again after waiting one year. At such time, the applicant will be allowed two attempts to meet the qualifying ASN Pre-Admission TEAS Assessment exam scores.

**The exam score is good for two years from the month and year of the exam.**

7. Applicants are subject to the competitive admissions selection process for these programs. The number of applicants admitted for any given semester is based on the number of available clinical spaces in the program as a whole and may vary by campus and semester. Openings are filled starting with the highest pre-requisite gpa.

If an additional competitive process is necessary due to the number of qualified applications, the following process will be used:

A total score will be calculated using 60% - Pre-requisite GPA and 40% - TEAS Total Score.

(Applicants are allowed two attempts to take the TEAS – calculations will be made using the sum of the HIGHEST English, Math, Reading and Science scores).

**Tiebreaker:** In the event of a tie in the ranking, the student's original college nursing application date (with no break in enrollment) will be used.

**NOTE:** Students will be required to complete Health Examinations and a Criminal Background report upon acceptance to the program. A current American Heart Association Health Care Provider BLS CPR card is required of all students entering the program. No other CPR cards will be accepted.

## **TEAS Pre-Admission Exam ASN Generic Spring 2025 (January 2025) Program – Tifton Campus**

You may register for the Pre-Admission ASN Assessment (TEAS) exam by calling or stopping by any of the SRTC Student Affairs offices. Make sure you are ready to commit to the exam session you select. There is an exam time limit. *TEAS exam fees must be paid prior to the exam.*

### **Note:**

- Receipt of SRTC Admissions Application, application fee, and all official transcripts are required prior to taking this exam.
- A valid state issued picture ID is required to sit for the exam – NO EXCEPTIONS
- Arrive ½ hour to 1 hour early. NO ONE ADMITTED AFTER POSTED TIME TO BEGIN EXAM SESSION.

The ASN Generic TEAS Pre-Admission exam schedule is listed below. *NOTE: Students are allowed two (2) attempts to make the SRTC – ASN program required score on the TEAS exam. If a second attempt is needed you will be required to take all sections of the exam.*

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# Applying for Financial Aid

**1. Know the School Year**

Choose the school year you wish to attend from the chart below. This will ensure you submit the correct FAFSA for the terms you wish to attend.

**2. Collect Documents**

Collect all necessary financial documents. Examples include Federal Tax Returns (1040), W2 forms, 1099s, unemployment statements and untaxed income statements, such as child support or disability statements. Students are required to provide their financial information on the FAFSA, and if applicable, financial information from their spouse, parent, and/or step-parent.

**3. Create a Federal Student Aid (FSA) User ID and Password**

**FSA Customer Service: 1-800-433-3243 (1-800-4-FEDAID)**

All students should create a FSA User ID and Password. For dependent students, a parent will also need to create an FSA User ID and Password. Your FSA User ID and Password serves as your electronic signature on the FAFSA, and will be used each year to renew your application. Please visit <https://fsaid.ed.gov> to create your User ID and Password.

**4. Go to [studentaid.gov](https://studentaid.gov) to complete your FAFSA. Select the correct school year from the drop down options.**

Once you (and your parent) have your FSA User ID and Password, you can begin your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Refer to the chart above to select the correct school year for the terms you wish to attend. If you (and/or your parent) are given the option to transfer your tax information to your FAFSA from the IRS, we strongly encourage you to USE THIS OPTION. Be sure to click Transfer for your tax information to be populated on your FAFSA. This may significantly reduce the time necessary to process your financial aid. Not all students or parents can use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool, for various reasons. If you are unable to use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool, you will need to manually enter your tax information as it appears on your tax document.

### Am I required to provide parent information?

If you can answer "Yes" to one of the questions below, you do NOT need parent information to complete your FAFSA.

- Are you 24 years of age?
- Are you married? (If married, you must include your spouse's income information)
- Do you have children or legal dependents that you financially support?
- Are you active duty military or a Veteran?

Note: All required financial aid documents must be submitted by the Priority Dates. Financial aid applications/documents submitted after priority dates will be processed, but funds may not be available on the first day of classes to apply towards tuition and fees or to purchase books. Students submitting financial aid applications after the priority date should be prepared to self-pay fees. Once financial aid is awarded, a student may be eligible for reimbursement.

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
