



**Albany State University and Southern Regional Technical College
Transfer Articulation Agreement
Expires December 2030**

Introduction

This agreement formally recognizes that the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia, by and on behalf of Albany State University (ASU) and Southern Regional Technical College (SRTC), are active educational partners in providing educational opportunities for currently enrolled and potential students of both institutions. Agreement to this partnership requires a commitment by both institutions to serve and facilitate a student's ability to transfer into a degree program without jeopardizing the intended mission and stated goals of either institution.

Agreement on Accreditation

Both parties agree to maintain regional accreditation through the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC). Should either institution lose accreditation through SACSCOC, the other institution may terminate the agreement through formal written notice.

Agreement on Communication

ASU and SRTC agree to cooperate in communicating with each other concerning the articulation relationship between the two institutions. Communications may include common publications and announcements concerning their affiliation. Announcements of this articulation and changes in the relationship will be released to the public in a coordinated manner by both institutions. The institutions will encourage the dissemination of information about programs in this agreement to interested and qualified students, with both institutions providing advising and counseling to prospective students.

Agreement on Articulated Courses

This agreement is specifically for students completing the courses included in this document at Southern Regional Technical College who are transferring to complete a baccalaureate degree at Albany State University. This agreement does not apply to other institutions in the University System of Georgia. Any SRTC student who completes the courses detailed herein at SRTC, is in good standing at SRTC, and meets the appropriate admission requirements to attend Albany State University will be assured that the courses listed in this agreement earned at SRTC will transfer to Albany State University. A minimum grade of "C" or above will be required for courses accepted for transfer.

No student may transfer more than 75% of the credit required for an associate or baccalaureate degree. Both institutions are committed to advising students accordingly so that credit earned is applied appropriately to the degree. Students who plan to change from a non-science major to a science major may need to take additional courses in the core curriculum. This agreement replaces any former agreement.

Agreement on Maintenance and Review


At least one administrator or faculty member will be appointed from each participating college/university to act as the primary point of contact and agent for this agreement, to speak on behalf of the institution, and to communicate details and modifications to respective faculty, advisors, and others with an interest at the individual institutions.

The parties will conduct an annual review of this Agreement to ensure compliance with any curriculum, legal, or organizational changes that either party may incur. Upon conducting this review, each party agrees to provide written

notification, at least thirty (30) days prior to the start of the upcoming semester, to the other regarding the revisions needed to bring the Agreement into compliance with the legal and ethical operations of each entity. If no notification is provided within the above prescribed time frame, the agreement shall automatically renew for another one (1) year term. This Agreement may be amended at any time by mutual written agreement of the parties. It may also be canceled at any time by either party upon providing not less than ninety (90) days' written notice to the other party; however, any students currently enrolled in the program may complete it.

Both parties agree to communicate annually any changes in the respective programs that may affect this articulation agreement. During the fifth year, both parties will review the agreement for revisions and possible renewal. If the agreement is not renewed by the end of the effective period, students currently enrolled as ASU students in the articulation program, who were engaged in the program prior to the termination of the agreement, will be provided with a teach-out plan by ASU to ensure the opportunity for degree completion.


Each party agrees to notify the other of any non-substantive changes.


