The National Alliance for Partnerships in Equity (NAPE) defines nontraditional occupations as those that employ less than 25% of males or females. Students enrolled in programs that are nontraditional for their gender are identified as “under-represented gender students in non-traditional programs.”

## DID YOU KNOW?



1. All occupational areas, both traditionally male and female, need highly skilled workers. Increasingly, gender does not matter if the person has the skills required for that occupation.
2. Women in non-traditional occupations, such as welding, architecture, and criminal justice, for example, usually earn more than they would earn in a traditionally ‘female’ occupation.
3. Many men who, in the past, were discouraged from entering jobs predominantly held by women are finding greater satisfaction and new opportunities in areas such as education, cosmetology, and healthcare.

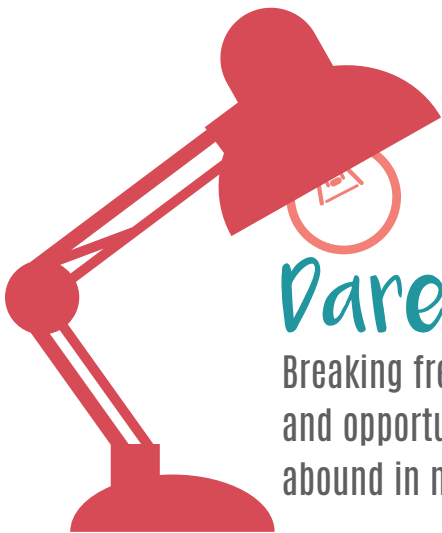
