Associate of Science in Nursing (ASN) Generic Program
Spring Semester 2022 (January 2022)
Competitive Admission Procedures

For admission into the occupational courses of the SRTC Associate of Science ASN Generic Program, requirements as outlined by the College must be met. Admission to the program is academically competitive.

If needed, prospective students will be ranked by several factors and the top candidates will be admitted to the Spring Semester 2022 (January 2022) class. Applications and admission requirements submitted after the posted deadlines will be held and reviewed for the next available class. Deadline for the January 2022 class is **Thursday, September 30, 2021**. Students will be notified by mail regarding their acceptance status once all file evaluations are complete.

Acceptance/Denial letters will be mailed out Monday, October 25, 2021.

Admissions Requirements:

1. Submit SRTC Admission Application and pay the one-time \$25 application fee. Applications are available at the SRTC Student Affairs office, online, or by printing the write-in version available through the college website: www.southernregional.edu.
2. Submit proof of age. (*Must be 18 years or older at the time of program entry*). Either a valid state driver's license or birth certificate is acceptable.
3. Submit **official** transcripts for high school diploma/GED **AND all** colleges and/or technical colleges (transferable credit or not) mailed to the SRTC Registrar's Office; Southern Regional Technical College, 800 Veteran's Parkway North, Moultrie, GA 31788.
4. Submit acceptable Admission Placement Exam scores OR have successfully completed with a "C" or better transferable degree-level English and Math from a regional or national accredited college, university, or other postsecondary institution recognized by the US Department of Education at the time the coursework was completed. These courses must be equivalent to the entry-level English and math required for our Associate of Science in Nursing Program. Acceptable Admissions Placement Exams include: ACT, SAT, PSAT, ACCUPLACER (Classic and Next Generation), GED, Georgia Milestones, HOPE GPA, COMPASS and ASSET. A student possessing an associate's degree or higher from a regionally accredited institution will be exempt from the placement requirements.
5. ASN applicants are required to complete all **highlighted pre-requisite courses** listed below by the September 30, 2021 deadline. **Highlighted prerequisite courses** must meet the **2.8 GPA** requirement. If a prerequisite course has been taken twice, only the last attempt is counted for prerequisite GPA purposes. Courses exempted or articulated do not carry GPA points.

NOTE: BIOL 2113, BIOL 2113L, BIOL 2114, BIOL 2114L, BIOL 2117, BIOL 2117L, and any degree-level math will not be considered if completed more than 5 years before admission to the ASN Program.

Failure to have completed ALL nursing pre-requisite will result in a delay in your acceptance date to the program.

6. All ASN applicants are required to take and attain the required score on the ASN Pre-Admission Assessment (HESI) exam, prior to being accepted into the ASN Program. The ASN Pre-Admission Assessment (HESI) exam is composed of the following sections: Math, Science (Anatomy and Physiology) and English (Vocabulary, Grammar, and Reading Comprehension). Applicants are strongly encouraged not to take the HESI exam until completing A&P I and II OR at least completing A&P I and some of A&P II. Applicants must also have a completed file prior to taking the HESI exam (excluding current college coursework).

Applicants will be allowed two attempts to pass the English, Math, and Science (Anatomy and Physiology) sections with a composite score of “75” on each section. Any applicant that is unsuccessful on the first HESI exam (in any section) is strongly encouraged to remediate prior to retaking that section(s) of the HESI exam. Several copies of the HESI Admission Assessment Exam Review, 5th Edition (ISBN# 9780323582261) are on reserve in all SRTC Libraries for student use. However, the HESI review book is also available for purchase online at www.elsevier.com.

Any applicant that does not attain a composite score of “75” on one or more sections of the HESI assessment exam after two attempts will not be considered for admission into the ASN Program. However, applicants can reapply to the ASN Program and take the ASN Pre-Admission exam again after waiting one year. At such time, the applicant will be allowed two attempts to meet the qualifying ASN Pre-Admission HESI Assessment exam scores.

The HESI exam score is good for two years from the month and year of the exam.

7. Applicants are subject to the competitive admissions selection process for these programs. The number of applicants admitted for any given semester is based on the number of available clinical spaces in the program as a whole and may vary by campus and semester. If an additional competitive process is necessary due to the number of qualified applications, the following additional point system will be used.

Pre-requisite GPA:

- 3.7 – 4.0 : 50 points
- 3.2 – 3.6 : 40 points
- 2.8 – 3.1 : 30 points

Tiebreaker: In the event of a tie in the ranking, the student's current HESI score will be used as the tiebreaker. In the event that a student has taken the HESI exam more than once, the current HESI scores will be averaged and the average of the two scores will be used in the tiebreaker process.

NOTE: Students will be required to complete Health Examinations and a Criminal Background report upon acceptance to the program. A current American Heart Association Health Care Provider BLS CPR card is required of all students entering the program. No other CPR cards will be accepted.

HESI Pre-Admission Testing ASN Generic Spring 2022 (January 2022) Program – Tifton Campus

You may register for the Pre-Admission ASN Assessment (HESI) exam by calling or stopping by any of the SRTC Student Affairs offices. Make sure you are ready to commit to the exam session you select. There is an exam time limit. *HESI exam fees must be paid prior to the exam.*

Note:

- Receipt of SRTC Admissions Application, application fee, and all official transcripts are required prior to taking this exam.
- A valid state issued picture ID is required to sit for the exam – NO EXCEPTIONS
- Arrive ½ hour to 1 hour early. NO ONE ADMITTED AFTER POSTED TIME TO BEGIN EXAM SESSION.

ASN Generic exam schedule: Students are allowed two (2) attempts to pass this exam. If a retake exam is required you will only need to take the section(s) of the exam which you did not meet the required score during your first attempt.
